
ShareChurch Hospitality & Leadership Workshops

Return Guidelines for Galena United Methodist Church

Our in-person worship services will be held at the Northern Lights pavilion at Recreation Park beginning on May 23rd at 10:30am. We believe that having an outdoor service should create the safest environment. The fresh moving air and families being properly distanced should greatly reduce or eliminate the chance for infection. We are planning to be in our sanctuary for services beginning in July 11th. We offer the following guidelines to maximize the safety and well being of all of those present:

- We will offer preregistration for those planning to attend. Please register on the church website so that we can plan according to expected numbers, etc. The registration link can be found at <u>galenaumc.org</u>. Registration is appreciated but not required for attendance.
- Masks are not required for persons who are fully vaccinated; however, those who feel more comfortable wearing a mask are encouraged to follow their comfort level. Persons who are not fully vaccinated are required to wear a mask.
- 3. The area will be cleaned and sanitized. Mr. Clean would be impressed!! There will be hand-sanitizing stations set-up as well.
- 4. We will have the area set up to ensure appropriate social distancing. Families, please sit together, we can get more people in the area this way. If you wish to bring lawn chairs for seating around and near the pavilion, that is certainly acceptable and helpful for the social distancing.
- 5. Offering plates will not be passed among congregants. We will have a central collection station in the pavilion for collection of the offering.
- 6. We will have bulletins (left untouched for 48 hours) available. We will also distribute the bulletin via e-mail in advance if attendees wish to print their own from home prior to attending the service.

All services will be recorded and uploaded by Sunday afternoon for those who are unable to attend in-person.

Also, please be aware that the Northern Lights pavilion is reserved for the Methodist Church for the full day on all summer Sundays. If you wish to use the area for any gatherings, please feel free to do so.

Medical Tip of the Week ... by Dennis



Now we who have been vaccinated can be unmasked, so what?

Until this pandemic ends around the globe, resistant variants are a real risk to all of us, even the fully vaccinated. A recent publication from the Wisconsin Council of Churches sets forth the following good advice on reopening our church:

DO:

- Continue to follow COVID-safe practices until background levels of virus are very low
- Plan gathering and building re-opening carefully and thoughtfully.
- Adopt a "two out of three" approach: masks, social distancing, gathering outdoors
- Follow state, local, and any ecclesial guidelines, which are not affected by the new CDC advice
- Provide an example of good health practices, particularly for children who have not been vaccinated
- Gather in ways that do not exclude or put at risk unvaccinated members of the community, such as children or medically vulnerable individuals

DON'T:

- Decide the pandemic is over
- Rush into re-opening, disregarding medical and commonsense advice
- Discard safe worship practices
- Ignore state or local health regulations or ecclesial requirements
- Act in ways that require unvaccinated or vulnerable members to choose between being safe and participating in the community

This is good advice. For our church, if we know that everyone in the room has been fully vaccinated, it is safe to unmask inside the building. However, if you feel more comfortable keeping your mask on, please do so. Caution and prudence will always be supported.

(a sharing from Superintendent Fabiola's May message)

The month of May is when we remember the Aldersgate experience from John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement. He felt the presence of the Holy Spirit and his life changed radically. John Wesley was a courageous man: he preached the gospel in many places and he was a prophetic voice at that time. In one of his sermons, he said, "Give me one hundred preachers who fear nothing but sin, and desire nothing but God, and I care not a straw whether they be clergy or lay; such alone will shake the gates of hell and set up the kingdom of heaven on Earth." This phrase of John Wesley, written in 1777, does not make distinctions. He asked for those who would be willing to serve the Lord without fear.
